Gallery Four has become a space dedicated to celebrating art works and artefacts from across the gallery's collection that inspire enquiry around animals. The selected artworks provide comment on animal encounters in domestic, natural and manipulated settings.

The conservation agenda of animals and their habitats is woven into the exhibition with the support of the community team at Chester Zoo. The world famous zoo is working to tackle one of the most urgent threats to species worldwide, the illegal wildlife trade. This exciting new partnership with Williamson's Art Gallery is a fantastic opportunity to provide people with the opportunity to explore and question our historic and current relationship with the natural world.
