Their multidisciplinary practice, spanning live performance, objects, text, and imagery aims to fosters connection, reflection, and transformative possibilities. Pierce has showcased their work internationally at events such as Darkness Visible in Athens and the Venice International Performance Art Week. They have received commissions from organisations such



as Arts Council England and have participated in an array of performance platforms worldwide.
